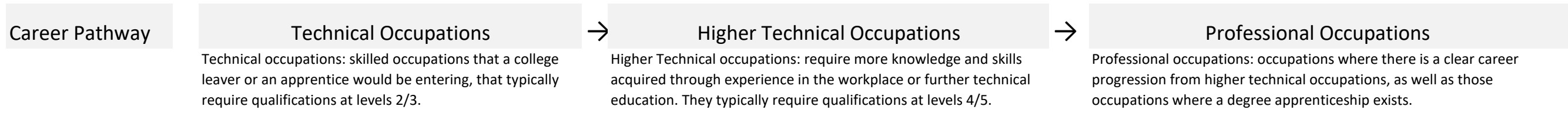


# Occupational Map: Care Services

This is one of 15 occupational maps that group together occupations that require similar knowledge skills and behaviours. Career pathways and occupational clusters have been used to provide further grouping of occupations, with the pathways indicating options for likely career progression. Every apprenticeship standard has been captured, as well as other skilled occupations where there is a substantial requirement for technical knowledge and practical skills. This map groups together similar occupations into one care services pathway. The technical occupations in this pathway have been identified as suitable for learning via apprenticeships only, so government does not intend to launch T levels for this route.

**Occupations in amber:** standard published  
**Occupations in red:** standard in development  
**Occupations in black:** occupation awaiting standard
