#### Welcome and declarations of interest

1. Kate Barclay welcomed the Committee and Institute officials to the meeting. The Chair asked Committee members whether they had any declarations of interest to make. Committee members confirmed that they had no interests to declare.

#### **Minutes**

2. The Committee considered the minutes from the last meeting on 28th September and were content with approving these.

#### Proposals, standards and assessment plan recommendations

3. The Committee noted that there was a higher number of degree apprenticeships submitted in this cycle, particularly in the Health and Science route. The Committee were informed that this was characteristic of the route where a large proportion of the standards required by the sector are at the higher levels. In general, the development of standards is employer led and trailblazer groups on certain routes have prioritised the professional level occupations on the occupational map, before returning to look at occupations at technical and higher technical levels. All the route panels are in the process of reviewing the occupational maps to ensure relevant occupations are covered and that the progression routes are in place.

### **Proposals**

- 4. The Committee then reviewed the 10 recommendations on proposals made by Route Panels as part of cycle 16. The Committee considered each of these proposals in detail and agreed with the Route Panel's recommendations on eight proposals. The following proposals were returned to the trailblazer groups:
  - Procurement & Supply (ST0810) proposal was returned as it does not meet the
    criteria for a stand-alone occupation as it could be delivered through the existing
    Business Administrator (Level 3) standard. The group should strengthen the distinction
    with the Business Administrator standard.
  - Data Specialist (Degree) (ST0763) proposal was returned as it does not meet the
    criteria for a stand-alone occupation as it could be delivered through the existing Data
    Scientist (Degree) Level 6 or the Data Technology Solution Specialist (Degree) Level 7
    standards. The group should use these standards and work with the other relevant
    trailblazer groups to include any appropriate additional content.

#### Committee Sampling for Standards and Assessment Plans

- 5. As part of their regular sampling of a selection of occupational standards and assessment plans, the Committee looked in detail at all the standards and assessment plans in the Construction Route. The Committee agreed with all the recommendations made by the Construction Route Panel.
- 6. The Committee challenged whether EPAs at Level 2 were consistently rigorous. Following a discussion, the Committee were content that the key consideration was to ensure that assessment is appropriate to the occupation and that this may differ between standards.

ACTION 1: The Assessment team will prepare a briefing on the approved methods of EPAs for the next meeting of the Approval & Funding Committee.

Returned Occupational Standards and End Point Assessment plans

- 7. The Committee considered standards and assessment plans that were recommended to be returned to trailblazer groups. The Committee agreed with the route panel decisions to return the following standards and assessment plans to trailblazer groups:
  - Keeper and Aquarist (Level 3) standard was returned because the standard needs to be restructured as a core and options to enable apprentices to develop knowledge and skills specific to different species.
  - Psychological Wellbeing Practitioner (Level 6) was returned because the knowledge, skills and behaviours did not align with Level 6 descriptors and a 12 month duration was too short.

#### **Funding Band recommendations**

- 8. The Committee considered and made recommendations on final funding bands for the following 17 apprenticeship standards:
  - ST0664 Library, Information and Archive Services Assistant
  - ST0135 Early Years Educator
  - ST0696 Post-Production Technical Operator
  - ST0460 Leather Craftsperson
  - ST0424 Broadcast and Communications Technical Operator
  - ST0607 Metal Fabricator
  - ST0695 Process Leader
  - ST0794 Midwife
  - ST0519 Physiotherapist
  - ST0517 Occupational Therapist
  - ST0299 Pharmacy Services Assistant
  - ST0616 Wireless Communications Rigger
  - ST0513 Groundworker
  - ST0269 Hire Controller
  - ST0485 Network Cable Installer
  - ST0584 Funeral Director
  - ST0394 Maritime Operations Officer

- 9. The Committee also considered and made recommendations on one indicative funding band (ST0056 Bid and Proposal Co-ordinator).
- The Committee considered each of these in detail including the views of the Route Panels.
- 11. The Committee was asked to defer the decision on one final funding band recommendation (Wireless Communications Rigger). The route panel and Committee approved the EPA on the condition that a portfolio element was included. This may affect the final EPA costs and consequently the funding band recommendation.
- 12. There was significant discussion in both the route panel and the Committee about the funding band for **Process Leader.** Although the trailblazer supplied additional information as requested, both the panel and the Committee had concerns about the proportion of costs associated with coaching in the quotes received. The agreed final funding band recommendation will give providers scope to include some specialist coaching within a blended learning package.

#### **T-Level recommendations**

- 13. The Committee were presented with an overview of the recent T-level submissions. The Committee agreed that it would be beneficial to get a more detailed induction on T-levels. This will be taken forward by Institute officials who will come back to a future meeting to set out roles and responsibilities. The Committee were content with the recommendations that have been made to date on the T-level content, including recent draft submissions for the Health and Science, Legal, Finance and Accounting and Engineering and Manufacturing routes.
- 14. The Committee felt that it would be helpful to prepare briefing on T-Levels for Board members and other colleagues.

ACTION 2: The Chief of Staff's office will raise this request with the T-Level Implementation team.

#### **Update on appeals**

15. The Committee were presented with an update on appeals. In summary the Institute

received 8 appeals from trailblazer groups in 2017, and 42 appeals since January 2018.

Of all of these appeals: 21 were rejected, 13 upheld, 13 not in scope, and 3 pending a

decision.

16. Every appeal this year (bar one) has been a funding band appeal. The Committee

discussed the challenges of providing greater transparency to the funding allocation

process and noted that work was underway to explore options. The Committee also

discussed the importance of consistently documenting the evidence base for funding

decisions and considered how to ensure this information could be systematised for Route

Panels and the Approval & Funding Committee.

17. The Committee agreed that the review of appeals and recommendations should be

presented to the Board.

ACTION 3: The Institute's Head of Legal and Chief of Staff's office to develop an

update on appeals for the Institute's Board meeting in January.
