7a. T Level in Health

The Progression Profile

This T Level has two occupational specialisms: Dental Nursing and Supporting Healthcare. For Supporting Healthcare there are five specialisms: Supporting the adult nursing team; Supporting the midwifery team; Supporting the mental health team; Supporting the care of children and young people; and Supporting the therapy teams

For these occupational specialisms, there are progression pathways into apprenticeships, education and work.

The T Level is based on an occupational standard. The occupational standard will have an apprenticeship option, which is referred to in the profile as the 'relevant apprenticeship'.

For some apprenticeships, in particular the relevant apprenticeship, a learner may have covered the content to a high level. They will not need to complete the apprenticeship in this step, this is noted as 'not applicable'. An apprenticeship may also be shortened due to recognised prior learning (RPL), this is noted as accelerated. Links to the mapping have been included which detail the areas in need of further development before full competence is reached in that occupation.

For work, whilst some roles may be accessed after completing the T Level, others are available after further training and gaining more experience.

1. Dental Nursing

For **apprenticeships** at level 3, the relevant apprenticeship <u>Dental Nursing</u> is not applicable. During the development of the T Level, General Dental Council (GDC) approval was obtained and learners will be able to progress into a dental nurse role as captured below in the work section.

At level 4, there is the <u>Orthodontic Therapist</u> and <u>Oral health practitioner</u> apprenticeship.

At level 5, there is the <u>Dental Technician</u>, <u>Clinical Dental Technician</u> and <u>Nursing</u> <u>Associate</u> apprenticeships.

Other progression options may include Management/Leadership and Coaching and Teaching.

For **education**, degree options may include Dental therapist and hygienist.

For **work**, career progression could include Dental Nurse, Dental Practitioner, Oral Health Practitioner, Community Oral Health Educator, Oral Health Champion, Dental Technician and Clinical Dental Technician.

2. Supporting Healthcare

For **apprenticeships** at level 3, the relevant apprenticeship <u>Senior Healthcare</u> <u>Support Worker</u> is <u>not applicable</u>. There is the level 3 <u>Ambulance Support Worker</u> and Lead Adult Care Worker apprenticeships.

At level 4, there is the <u>Associate Ambulance Practitioner</u> and <u>Lead Practitioner in Adult Care</u> apprenticeship.

At level 5, there is the <u>Healthcare Assistant Practitioner</u>, <u>Nursing Associate</u> and <u>Leader in Adult Care</u> apprenticeships.

At level 6, there is the Enhanced Clinical Practitioner, Registered Nurse (degree), Occupational Therapist (integrated degree), Physiotherapist (integrated degree), Diagnostic Radiographer (degree), Dietician (degree) and Paramedic (degree).

At level 7, there is the Advanced Clinical Practitioner apprenticeship.

For **education**, HTQ options may include Assistant Practitioner in Healthcare, FdSc Healthcare Practice and Healthcare Professions' Support for England. Degree options may include Adult Nursing, Child Nursing, Mental Health Nursing and Midwifery.

For **work**, career progression could include Support worker, Assistant Practitioner, Social worker, SEND Coordinator, Midwife, Rehabilitation worker, Ambulance Support Worker, Assistant Practitioner, Nursing Associate.
